The report has received the benefit of valuable suggestions from Professor Charles B. Davenport. The studies were made in the period extending from June 4-July 27, 1903, and numerous surface hauls were made under most favorable conditions for working. The medusa-fauna of the Bahamas is poor in comparison with that of the Tortugas, Florida. For example, the writer secured ninety species of Hydromedusae, Scyphomedusae, Siphonophorae, and Ctenophorae at the Tortugas, while only forty-three species were found at the Bahamas. What is more interesting, the relative abundance of specific forms is quite different in the two regions. Thus the three commonest species at the Tortugas are *Pseudoclytia pentata*, *Halitiara formosa*, and *Turritopsis nutricula*; yet the first was not found at the Bahamas, while the two others were rare.
